#### Some Cultural Items for the Month

### <u>Cultural Corner</u>: A guide to Norwegian bunads - Norway's national costumes - part 2

How do people choose their bunad? Some people choose their bunad for sentimental reasons, if for example, a grandmother has sown it by hand. For others, it represents their hometown or identity. Whilst there is no set rule for selecting a bunad, it is assumed that it represents an area that you have a strong connection to, so be prepared to engage in conversation with those dressed in the same design as you!

What are the most popular bunads? Everyone likes their bunad, but let's face it, some are nicer than others! Thanks to their growing popularity, the public weigh in on an annual poll distributed by newspapers across Norway.



Oslo. King Harald together with Queen Sonja in the East Telemark bunad. Photo: Terje Pedersen / NTB scanpix *Here are three of the most popular:* **East Telemark:** Today, East Telemark has many variations in its bunads,

including the "red shirt bunad" that dates to the early 1800s. With family from Telemark and an interest in fashion, Queen Sonja was presented with this bunad as a wedding gift from her mother and wore it on May 17 last year. The red waist is non-negotiable, but the embroidery and colors vary. The men of East Telemark are in for an equally dashing look, complete with a white, green, or grey jacket.

**Hardanger:** At the turn of the century, the traditional costume from Hardanger was the first to evolve into a bunad. Women from across Norway wore this bunad to show their support for independence from Sweden. As a result, this distinctive white apron and red vest went on to earn the nickname, "Nasjonalen" (the National). The bunad for men typically includes a red or green waistcoat, cream socks, and a black jacket.

**Nordland:** Inspired by earlier traditional clothing, the youth association submitted this original design in 1928. It comprises of a white blouse, woolen apron, shawl, bag, and silver jewelry. Additional accessories include a headdress and cape. Initially, the youth association wanted green wool but quickly settled for blue as it was difficult to obtain in the 1920s. Today, the bunad comes in both colors and has consistently won the nation's hearts in the annual poll for Norway's best national costume.

How much does a bunad cost? If you have ever been to Norway, then you will know that things do not come cheap and the bunad is no different! Prices vary but expect to pay between NOK 20,000 and NOK 50,000 for everything, including the accessories. The cheaper range is often manufactured abroad, whereas the higher range reflects Norway's handmade craftsmanship and lasts a lifetime. With life's stresses, we all know that waistline expansion is inevitable, but take comfort in knowing that your bunad will grow with you!

## History Article: The Rose Church -- part 1

Tucked away in the Norwegian mountains of More og



Romsdal *fy/ke* (county) is a church in the small village of Stordal that has attracted the attention of historians and contemporary rosemalers alike. Why? Because the Rosekyrkja, or Rose Church. contains an example of early

Renaissance-Baroque rosemaling that is so Important and utterly splendid, it ls worth studying in more detail.

**From Renaissance to Rosemaling:** Anyone interested in Norwegian history would be well aware that many old Master Rosemalers were Itinerant painters who earned their living traveling and painting in regional Norway. They were primarily employed to decorate churches with Renaissance-Baroque motifs, a style that, In the 18th century, had long since waned in popularity elsewhere.

Ironically, the isolation of rural Norwegian communities from outside fashion trends was what fostered an evolution in the development of Norwegian painting. The folk artists Interpreted and adapted rudimentary Renaissance motifs and changed them into a more distinctive and specialized form. As time passed, this style of painting proved so popular that demand Increased. As well as walls and callings in churches, there was enthusiasm for furniture and other common objects around the home to be decorated with rosemaling motifs. Collectively, all the differing styles are what we have come to know as Norwegian rosemaling.

Location of Stordal: Against the backdrop of a rural landscape dotted with neat red barns and fringed with spectacular fjords, 1 traveled from Andalsnes on the West Coast of Norway as part of a Vesterhelm tour group in 2014. After driving through valleys so



narrow and steep they make you feel like an ant. we reached Stordal and RosekyrkJa, 35 miles east of Alesund.

**The History of Churches in Stordal:** Since1350 and possibly earlier, a stave church has stood in Stordal. In 1766, Clergyman Hans StrOm wrote that the village had a small and modest church that Is not particular in any way. The building Is maintained by the congregation that also owns it.

By the 1780s, the stave church had begun to collapse and was demolished. As it was the custom to recycle and reuse materials, timber from the old church was salvaged and used, together with local materials, to build an eight-sided church on the same site
